**Subject: LSPQs starred question 456 "Suicide by SC/ST Students" asked by SHRI S. VENKATESAN**

Sir,

With reference to your email dated 29.03.2023 on the above mentioned subject, requisite information pertaining to IIT Bombay is furnished below:

- (a) **Whether the Government has noticed that there is an increase in cases of suicide by students in educational institutions like IITs including IITChennai and IIT-Mumbai, NITs, IIMs, Central/State Universities and AIIMS especially among students from Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Class Communities;**
- In IITB there has not been any observable increase.
- (b) **If so, the details thereof along with the number of these students who committed suicide during the last five years and the current year in said institutes, State/year-wise including Odisha;**
- In the last five years we had three cases: one (general category) that happened outside the campus, one (OBC category), and the recent one (SC category) inside the campus.
- (c) **Whether the cases of suicide are proportionately higher in case of students pursuing higher education, if so, the details thereof and the reasons therefor;**
- This hypothesis cannot be established as out of three cases at IIT Bombay, two were postgraduate and one was an undergraduate student.
- (d) **Whether the Government has given any directive to the State Governments in this regard, if so, the details thereof;**
- Ministry to respond.
- (e) **Whether the Government has proposed to initiate a legislation to stop caste/race-based discrimination in the higher educational institutions, if so, the details thereof; and**
- Ministry to respond.
- (f) **The steps taken or proposed to be taken by the Government to prevent such instances of suicides and circumstances where students are pressurised to take such extreme steps?**
- All HEIs are setting up student wellness centers, running awareness programs. HEIs including IITB allow slow-paced academic programs. IITB has set up a committee to reduce academic stress in the 1st year. NEP has also introduced multi-exit options for students who wish to quit without completing the full program

**Subject: Rajya Sabha Question 646 to be answered on 26.07.2023 regarding the "Migration of Indian students to foreign countries"- reg.**

Sir,

With reference to your email dated 24.07.2023 on above mentioned subject, requisite information pertaining to IIT Bombay is furnished below:

**(a) The number of students who pursued their higher studies in foreign countries and subsequently have started working outside India in the past five years, details thereof;**

**Ans -** We do not have exact data on how many students go abroad for higher education. The number would be around 3-4% of the students, i.e., about 30 to 40 students per batch, and several of them, after earning higher degrees, return to India.

**(b) Whether the government has any data or studies that analyse the reasons behind the migration of Indian students, particularly those with advanced degrees, details thereof;**

**Ans –** MoE may Reply

**(c) Whether the government has undertaken any initiatives to strengthen collaborations between Indian educational institutions and foreign universities to reduce the need for them to seek education abroad, details thereof; and (d) If not, the reasons therefore?**

**Ans -** IITB have schemes for students to spend a semester abroad at foreign universities at all levels. The students can do course work and project work at foreign universities with whom IIT Bombay has an MoU. This gives not only International exposure to the students but also enhances personal growth, cultural exposure, academic benefits and networking opportunities while they continue to receive their degree from IITB.

We have set up several programs for Post Graduates with foreign universities i.e. Joint Doctoral Degree, Joint Master Degree, Dual Doctoral Degree and Co-supervised PhD Program. This enables our students to get opportunity to work with foreign professors as well while still remaining as our students.

IITB also have partnerships with renowned Indian universities namely National Institute of Technology, Andhra Pradesh; Plaksha University, Punjab; Naval Institute of Educational & Training Technology, Kerala; Indian Institute of Information Technology Senapati, Manipur and many others thereby facilitating semester exchange, research exchange and short-term program.
